ROCK AROUND THE WORLD

- usable sculptures in public space

Opening: 20 September 2013, 5 - 7 pm

Exhibition period: 21 September - 3 November 2013

With the exhibition ROCK AROUND THE WORLD Molly Haslund presents a series of sculptures and objects in public space, which invite the public to move around the city in new ways. The city's hedges, benches and playgrounds inspire and interrelate with Haslund's works. There are completely new as well as older pieces located around Roskilde city, all in dialogue with the architecture and activities that typically unfold here.

Haslund calls her works 'coordination models' because just like playground structures or obstacles, they require a degree of coordination from those who move around on them.

Molly Haslund's models are a physical reflection on how we use and move around in urban space. She chalks out lines for an investigation of how hedges, walls, lines and other abstract enclosures demarcate and define our scope of action.

Among the exhibited structures, there is a two-step-ladder leading up to a platform placed on top of the hedge into the Roskilde Priory. From this little balcony, you suddenly have the chance to look over the hedge and into the priory garden on the other side.

"The hedge normally acts as a boundary and now you can go up and on top of it. And, it is probably in this notion that coordination lies for me. That you relate to something with your own body in a different way than you usually do." Besides the balcony, Haslund has constructed a copy of the typical blue 'Roskilde bench', but in half the size: a children's bench next to the adult bench.

"Children often play games where they copy adults: Playing 'families' etc. There are already benches on the playground from which the adults can watch their children playing. With a child sized bench in the same place, children can copy the adults and play 'adults' that are watching children. This provides a funny and thought provoking duality." The older works are a series of playground structures: a swing set, a hopscotch court and a skipping rope construction, which are all scaled to adult size and invite the public to swing, hop and skip together. The swing set is an extension of a regular swing set with two or more swings in a row. Here, we find a whole row of swings hung up behind each other in two rows and the skipping rope construction consists of four skipping ropes attached to the one end of a 7-sided column. Besides being an invitation to play, these structures also offer a challenge, namely to coordinate the use of the playground structures between the participants.

Molly Haslund graduated from the Royal Danish Academy of Arts in 2005 and has an MFA from Glasgow School of Art (2003 - 2005). She works in the space between performance, sculpture and installation with reference to the visual arts, stand up, variety, literature and music. Haslund has worked with projects that range from personal rituals and socially engaging workshops to interaction design.
